Jade never gave up, even though she wanted to, many times. "I was working full time and in school full time. Sometimes things got really tough. Hope and a Future Project was always there helping me with my school needs. Like when I sometimes struggled academically with a class, my mentor Tonya was there to encourage me and guide me in the right direction. My family is very supportive, Jade says. They help me care for Jayden when I was working and taking college classes. Hope and a Future Project's workshops, gave me the opportunity to be around peers who are experiencing the same challenges as me. We are able to lift each other up." says Jade.

Raised in northern Delaware, Jade graduated from Hodgson Vo-Tech High School. Jade was a freshman at Wesley College and at just 18 years old she learned she was pregnant. Jade gave birth to a son, Jayden. At the beginning of the next school year, she transferred to University of Delaware. After earning an Associate's degree there, she was accepted into Wilmington University where she graduated with a Bachelor's Degree in Marketing in January 2018.

Jade is 26 years old today. It took her 7 years to finish 2 degrees but she never gave up. She persevered and did really well in school. She had many reasons to be discouraged by so many distractions around her but she pushed through. Jade says, "Hope and a Future Project influenced her to stay in school and be determined to graduate. They gave me the confidence to believe in myself even when I doubted myself. I am so thankful to God, my family and Hope and a Future Project who helped me achieve a greater future for me and my son. They have played a vital role in my growth as a mother, employee and student."

Hope and a Future Project has made such an impact on me that I am now helping as a volunteer. I like being a part of something bigger than me. Helping teen parents to reach their full potential and realize anything is possible is how I want to give back. I was part of the first scholar class, when the program was new. Today, it's great to see how much they've grown.

What's next for Jade? Jade currently works at Bank of America and is looking forward to finding a job in the Marketing field. I also want to go back to school to pursue my master's degree. In three to five years I'd like to own my own company and be even more involved with Hope and a Future Project. I also see myself married, expanding my family, owning a home and buying a dog.

### **Impacting Our Communities**

I've been asked many times, What drew you to this field and How did you begin this work?

Less than two percent (2%) of teen mothers who have a baby by age 18 earn a college degree before age 30. -- The National Campaign to Prevent Teen and Unplanned Pregnancy

I start with this statistic because this is the problem we are working to solve. I have lived this mission with my daughter, Jade, who in her freshman year in college became pregnant. She gave birth to our grandson the summer between her freshman and sophomore years. My daughter heard the same messages that many people who find themselves in her situation hear; your life is over. You won't be able to stay in or go to college; even though she was academically strong and on the deans list. It was still the message. It was now more than ever, that she needed a college degree because she would have a little one to care for. She stayed in college and graduated from two local universities—University of DE and Wilmington University. Just like other students, it was a challenge, and it was difficult but with our support, she is now able to provide for herself and her son and create an incredible future.

It could have turned out in a different way if she had not gone to college. It sparked a fire inside of me, God was guiding me, and I really wanted to help other teen parents experience the same success. As I did my research the gap in services for teen parents to enter and persist in college became quickly evident.

My grandson, Jayden was 3 years old when we started Hope and a Future Project. Who would have thought then that this organization would grow and be sustained over the last 5 years to impact the lives of teen moms and their children in our communities and completely change the trajectory of their lives. To date you have help us invest in their futures by providing over \$ 20,000.00 in scholarships, over 50 hours of practical life skills training and hundreds of one-on-one mentoring hours of emotional support and guidance.
